### **EYAM CE PRIMARY SCHOOL is now registered for Tax-Free Childcare!!**

Tax-Free Childcare helps eligible working families with the cost of childcare by paying 20% of childcare fees. For every £8 a parent pays into their childcare account, the government will add an extra £2. Parents can use Tax-Free Childcare all year round including for out of school and holiday provision, and it is available for childcare aged up to 11 years. To find out more about Tax-Free Childcare and the other schemes, please visit <a href="www.childcarechoices.gov.uk">www.childcarechoices.gov.uk</a> where these schemes are explained in more detail, including the eligibility criteria and how to apply. You will need our school Reference Number to apply: 112816 (and may need to type in the postcode in capitals with no spaces).

The following link provides a process for how parents can use TFC: <u>Tax-Free Childcare for Parents or Carers</u>

In addition in case you are not aware, through the <u>Childcare element of Universal Credit</u> eligible parents may be able to claim back up to 85% of their childcare costs.

### **Eligibility**

You may be eligible for 30 hours of free childcare if your circumstances are as follows:

Both parents are earning or expect to earn the equivalent of at least 16 hours per week at the <u>National Living Wage or National Minimum Wage</u> over the coming three months. If you are an apprentice, you may still qualify.

This applies whether you are in paid employment, self-employed or on zero hours contract.

The parent (and their partner where applicable) should be seeking the free childcare to enable them to work.

Where one or both parents are on maternity, paternity, shared parental or adoption leave, or if they are on statutory sick leave.

Where one parent meets the income criteria and the other is unable to work because they are disabled, have caring responsibilities or have been assessed as having limited capability to work.

Where a parent is in a 'start-up period' (i.e. they are newly self-employed) they do not need to demonstrate that they meet the income criteria for 12 months.

If a non-EEA national, the parent must have recourse to public funds.

The eligibility criteria **will not** be met when:

Either parent has an income of more than £100,000

In a two-parent household where one parent is not working and does not meet any of the above criteria

### **Y1 Phonics**

### Y2 SATs

It will soon be time for the end of Key Stage One assessments known as 'SATs'. The English reading and mathematics tests were previously mandatory, but they became optional from the academic year 2023 to 2024. We have decided to carry out the tests next term; as previously, we will use the results- along with the work your child has done throughout the year- to help understand how your child is progressing at the end of KS1 as they transition to KS2. We will continue to include the test results in your child's annual school report as part of their achievements and general performance. We run the tests as part of daily activities and they take place throughout the next half term, please do not get your child worried about them by asking if they have done them yet – the children might not know as we run practise activities as well! Remember tests only give a snapshot of attainment on any given day and staff here use it as one piece of the progress jigsaw, do come and talk with staff if you have any questions.
