

Science

- Our Science topic this summer is about Habitats!
- We will be identifying basic needs for survival and thinking how that links to Habitats.
- We will also be looking at and comparing different types of Habitats.

Mathematics

- In Maths this term Reception will finish their work on sharing and grouping, before exploring patterns and maps.
- Y1 will also be busy in maths, learning about Position and Direction, Money and Time, as well as recapping Place Value.
- Y2 will finish their work on Time. They will then explore Statistics and Position and Direction.
- As usual, we will also practise our Mental Maths skills by taking part in weekly sessions where they choose and work on a special Fluency Target with a teacher.

Music

- This summer, we will continue exploring singing, actions, pitch, tempo, keeping the beat and feeling the rhythm using the inspiring Charanga Music programme. Our unit of work this term focuses on consolidating prior learning and exploring the History of Music.
- We will also join in with whole-school singing for July's Leavers' Service.

Computing

In computing, we will be exploring programming and coding using Scratch JR.

We will be learning that sequences of commands have an outcome. We design our own quiz questions and understand that these designs are using blocks of code.

Moorlands



Art & D/T

- In Art this summer we will explore collage and textiles, making mixed media pictures and beautiful woven artworks inspired by Eyam moor and a number of fabulous local and international female textile artists. We will use sewing to create embellishment, using sequins, beads and natural materials.

PE

We will be focusing on team games including developing our racket skills, throwing skills, sportsmanship and also getting ready for our Sports Day.

English

- Once again, we will continue our important daily Phonics sessions, as well as taking part in regular handwriting, SPaG and Guided Reading lessons.
- Our topic writing will be inspired by extracts from Kenneth Graham's classic book "The Wind in the Willows". We will explore its characters and settings, acting the stories out and writing our own.
- In our non-fiction work we will think about how to look after our beautiful moors, writing persuasive letters and making posters about pollution and littering.

Topic Work

- Our Topic has a Geography theme this summer. We will learn to name and locate on a map the four countries and capitals of the UK. We will then use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language [near and far; left and right], to describe the location of features and routes on a map.
- Finally, we will explore the key physical and human characteristics of moorland habitats in our local area, considering the impact of tourism on wildlife and habitats.

Spiritual, Moral, Social & Cultural

- Our new RE Topic is Judaism. We are going to explore several key questions, including asking Who is Jewish and what do they believe? Why do Jews celebrate Passover? and What does it mean to belong to a Jewish faith community?
- In PSHE we are going to focus on "Changes". We will identify ways to manage big feelings; identify feelings associated with change and loss; explore how to manage when we find things difficult; and explain how people's needs change as they grow from young to old.
