#### ALL WELCOME

All the classes have taken part in wellbeing activities to help the children learn to work as a team and enjoy finding out about each other. It is so important to learn how to be happy as a class as well as starting on revising and extending our writing skills and place value knowledge! Over the weeks we focus on different elements of using a growth mindset and this helps us to learn that making mistakes is the cool way to improve and be a learning wizard.

Wellbeing Wednesday - we will be taking Y2-6 on a weekly ramble up to the football pitch and back as long as the weather holds. PLEASE ensure they have dry shoes and a change of socks ready to put on when they get back to school and that they arrive in their trainers. Small pump bags can be hung on pegs so trainers can dry off.
