Did you know?

In each class we have a set of non-negotiables so that there is a consistent approach across school. We thought it helpful to share them with you: If you have any questions then do make a time to chat with Mrs Gilbertson.

- 1. Clear lesson objectives
- 2. Small 'steps to success' for writing
- 3. Displays to show key questions and vocabulary
- 4. Praise and feedback for using exciting, new topic or subject skills vocabulary
- 5. Support with developing into a powerful reader. All use thought/speech bubble and PROVE IT!
- 6. Individual writing targets
- 7. HOT (Higher order thinking) on display and referred to especially this year analysis and synthesis
- 8. Reading regularly throughout school both 1:1, topic, class reader, comprehension and on display
- 9. Feedback and marking refer to skills from small steps
- 10. Children are encouraged to recall their previous learning on a regular basis.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let school know.
