Teenage cancer is a frightening concept and as we have had a pupil in school who came through treatment we wanted to mark the importance of ongoing research and care.



We have again received the **Green Flag Award** - this is a huge piece of work, led by the staff and involves all the children over two years. When you hear that we are looking into how to reduce our carbon footprint by recycling, reducing plastic waste, cycling/walking to school, turning off lights, insulating the roof space, planting saplings to increase biodiversity, feeding the birds, building hedgehog houses, learning how to cook fresh food, enhancing the play space, supporting our partner school in Burkina Faso or learning how to save water - then it all counts towards being an Eco School. There are 10 areas to cover which we try hard to embed within the curriculum - if anyone wants to be more involved there are lots of opportunities, in particular we'd love a regular grow cook and eat lead!

#### Reading Fluency

We are focussing on improving how fluently the children read.

We ask everyone to read around their environment - cereal packets, road signs, labels, baking instructions, newspaper headline.

In the Infants we ask you to re-read the same book several times to help them build confidence and to reduce sounding out individual words - this can take several re reads and may only be a couple of pages at the start.

In the lower juniors the children need to read using the correct punctuation and learn to read phrases so they make sense - again re reading a passage to practise is a very good idea.

In the older years we suggest you really encourage a section to be reread from longer books with the focus on intonation, humour and the simple pleasure of being able to read with confidence.

Make sure you take turns so do model how it should sound.

Do develop book talk by chatting about the text, predicting what might happen and as importantly why things have happened so far. These are all crucial steps to becoming an independent confident and fluent reader.

Reminder to say goodbye to children on the yard please rather than going through to the green zone or to the classroom door. Thank you.

## National School Meals Week 2023 is 6<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> November Celebrating 30yrs of school meals


