Learn more: childrensmentalhealthweek.org.uk 1 in 6 children and young people now have a diagnosable mental health condition. By taking part in Children's Mental Health Week 2024, we can help to ensure that children and young people across the UK feel listened to and know that they're not alone. A quote from footballer Marcus Rashford: "Finding your voice and purpose in life is one thing, but, very often, when it is time to use that voice and make a change, you will need a bit of teamwork to make things happen" (from You Can do It; How to find your voice and make a difference, 2022).

We asked the children a series of questions – some with ratings and others with explanations and ideas. It showed that boys and girls felt safe at school with the field being safest. There is a fabulous array of games being played on the yard. The children can list how to be a good friend and 91% said they were never or not often hurt. When they needed help they could name an adult to speak to with more infants than Juniors saying they would talk to a staff member as well as parents whilst 75% of Juniors said they would talk to friends more. This shows how important it is that we continue to teach children how to be a good friend, to listen and show empathy as well as when to go for adult help. These are all part of the PSHE curriculum but it is worth revisiting and reminding what to do when we fall out. Some children have worries from the state of the world environment to loosing friends or scary stories being told (We hope to have already addressed the scary stories). 73% reported they were never alone at playtimes and whilst some choose to play alone the School Council have agreed to promote the Play Buddy role and the friendship bus stop and introduce a 'shout out of thanks' for those who are friendly. A really useful Questionnaire. Thank you.
