FANTASTIC!**

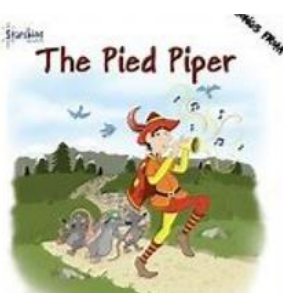
